
Providing Extra Time on Quizzes

Canvas currently allows users to choose between utilizing Classic Quizzes or New Quizzes in Canvas. Some divisions strictly use Classic Quizzes.

Warning: Setting an Until Date

Please be very careful when setting "Until" dates for a quiz as it will override extra time provided to a student and end their quiz. Likewise, if a student has until 11:59 pm to take a quiz and has a time limit of an hour, they must begin the quiz by 10:59 pm to receive the full 60 minutes. A student with a 1.5 extra time extension would need to begin by 10:29 pm to receive the full 90 minutes.

Extra Time - Classic Quizzes

If an instructor is using Classic Quizzes and has set a time limit for the quiz, extended time must be set for each assessment once the quiz has been published. Instructors must calculate the time and provide the student with the additional minutes they need. This is a step-by-step guide on <u>Classic Quizzes: How can I give my students extra time?</u>

Extra Time - New Quizzes

If an instructor is using New Quizzes and has set a time limit for the quiz, they can create an accommodation rule for a student that applies to all new quizzes a student takes within the course. This rule is set within the Moderate tab by either providing a fixed amount of additional minutes (ex. 30 minutes) or a multiplier of additional time (ex. 1.5), so Canvas will calculate how many minutes students should receive based on the duration of the quiz.
